

Cruise by tender or kayak silently through the Wayag lagoon and its magical maze of 'gumdrop' islands.

Sail in the realm of King Neptune as the ship crosses the Equator, jump into the North and swim or dive towards the great seas of the Southern Hemisphere. Diving & snor

Day 7 : Cape Kri

Final dives at Cape Kri in the morning, maybe go snorkel to the Passage, then afterno mangroves kayaking .

Disembark in Sorong.
